# iBook G4 | GHz | 14"

**WHAT I FOUND:** When I began using the new 1 GHz iBook, the first thing I noticed was the nearly silent keyboard. The keys are quick, fluid and responsive. A very comfortable, yet solid, keyboard. The second thing is purely speed. From Photoshop to [my daughter's favorite] games that are notoriously taxing on a system, this box rocks! Apps launch in a flash and everything is great under Panther. I didn't want to do a "Panther" review, but it is clear that this hardware takes full advantage of the features with ease. In particular, Expos © is nearly instantaneous. I read a lot of comparisons between PowerBooks and iBooks before making this purchase that was intended to be solely for my daughter's use; however, the "users" and "sharing" control panels in the systems preferences were opened on day one after getting this thing set up.

template that I use for my product reviews and, in most hardware items, I usually omit this entry. For the iBook, there were some things to address that were important to mention in the set up, so here they are: First, you will want broadband. The modem works well and performance is up to par by modem standards; however, you'll want the modem for the fax features more than use with an ISP. Second, you will need to run your software update control panel more than once in most cases. This goes for any new Mac system and is really important to getting the most/best out of your new Mac. Third, once you know that you have restarted and rerun your updates so that they are all complete, you may

want to add your peripherals. That might be a printer, iSight, scanner, iPod or whatever, and, for the most part, these items will plug in and go without a hitch. I would STILL recommend visiting versiontracker.com and/or the vendor's web site to be sure that you have the latest drivers for your products. This is a guideline more than a rule, so I'd also recommend taking a minute to read MacFixIt, and other online resources, to check on issues that may have already come up with some products.

**LIKES :** This box feels solid, well-built and it is really a wonderful product with a TON of bang for the buck. It will do everything you need it to do for most average daily Mac users and it has a gorgeous monitor

that, once calibrated, gives you a very crisp and clear image that exceeds many other portables (including my trusty ol' TiBook). Of course, I added the AirPort Extreme card and the performance is flawless; completely living up to what is now the standard for WiFi reception set by this iBook's predecessors. The latches and hinges are strong and substantial so this is a terrific choice for students and professionals on the move.

# Mac FlipAlbum 3 Pro Allows Easy Cross Platform Transition

I've been working on an interactive children's book that would be easy to pop in any computer and it would begin to run automatically.

The closest technology I've found that works with today's technology, is Mac FlipAlbum® 3 Pro. The program has cross platform capability, allows one to produce background sounds using MP3, WAV and MID files; As well as importing popular image formats such as .GIF, .PNG, and .JPG.

You also have the capability of inserting translucent text.

The album itself allows an intuitive 3-D experience. You can set the pages to flip automatically or manually in the preferences. You can preview an individual image in full screen mode, display file names for easy reference, flip to the page you want to view by clicking on thumbnails on the contents page.

FlipAlbum® Pro 3 also enables drag & drop and the ability to place multiple images on a single page.

The program allows you to create your own themes, choose from ready made themes provided with the package, or there are several you can download at [www.flipalbum.com](http://www.flipalbum.com). You can also purchase designs from other FlipAlbum users. I'm a graphic artist so I prefer to create

my own designs.

There are many security features on FlipAlbum® 3 Pro. Such an image encryption option to protect your copyrighted material or images from being taken from the CD. You can also password protect your work to allow limited access for others to share or use. One can also embed copyright watermarks to images; This is very useful for sending out sample CD's to potential customers. While we're on the subject of protection, the photo lock option makes it so your images on your CD can't be printed. You are also allowed to set up expiration dates so the CD will not work after a certain date.

There are many options you



can choose from in the preferences. I'll just go over a few.

- Cover- you can choose any number of colors or you can pick out themes
- Right page, Left page or



Centerfold mode- allows you to select different items for the backgrounds of your pages

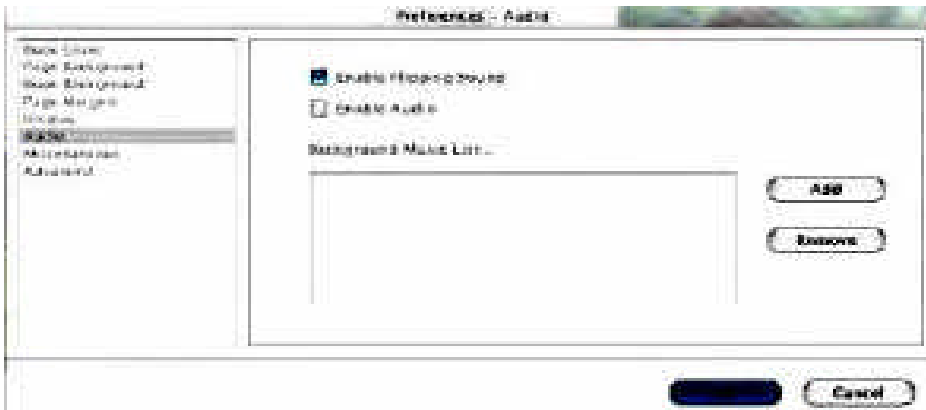
- Auto Flipping- allows you to set the amounts of time you want each page to hold before it turns automatically

- Sound- allows you to choose if you want page flipping sounds and whether or not you want background sound

These are just a few of many options you will find in the preferences area.

The program's capabilities are extensive and useful for people who are in photo and graphics industries especially.





Portfolios and presentations can easily be created and exported to share cross platform.

There is one more option that I should mention. Mac FlipAlbum® Pro 3 will allow you to export as many albums as a CD can handle. It's library capabilities allow one to choose any particular album from the library book-

shelf.

There are certain things I would like to see developed for future editions of FlipAlbum® Pro 3 for the Mac, such as; animated .gif capability and the ability to incorporate movie files as well as incorporate a codec to make it possible to play on standard DVD players. I hope in time that those options will be available for Macintosh users.

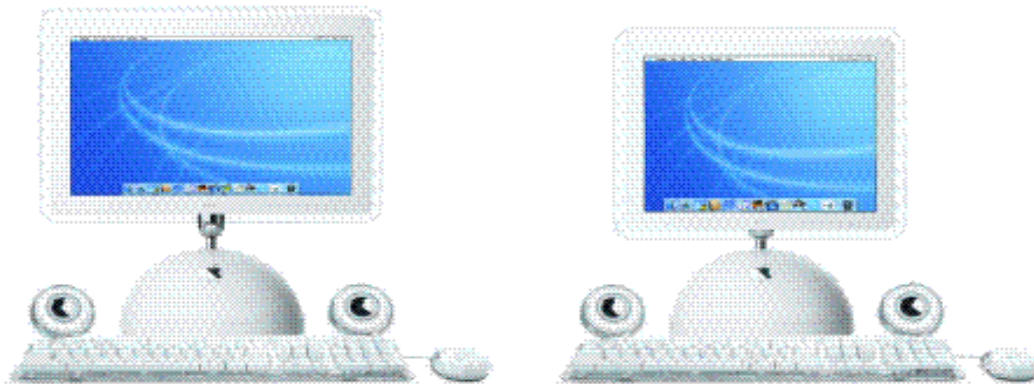

# QUICK VOICE 1.7.3 AN INTUITIVE WAY TO RECORD TO YOUR MAC

If you ever have had a need to record to your Macintosh this is a very simple utility that does just that! I shouldn't say *just that*, because Quick Voice allows you to also create

- Play next, previous, play all stickies from the stickies menu
- Play recordings in a loop
- Style text, select fonts, search text in stickies

to MP3 with just one click. These are just some of the features QuickVoice has.

The following charts will help you see all the options in QuickVoice.



Button	Keyboard	Function
P	Space	Play Play message. Click again to stop playing.
⏪	Left Arrow	Reverse Go to previous message. If a message is already playing the previous message starts playing.
⏩	Right Arrow	Forward Go to next message. If a message is already playing the next message starts playing.
⏮	⌘	Sliderbar Drag for undo-arrow to any slider line then play-message. Reverse/Forward are disabled and Play does not advance to the next message in the queue.
⏸	⌘	Sound Control Returns control into volume for the current recording. Best and Treble control set type for all recordings.

Button	Keyboard	Function
+	None	Reverse Reverses message in the queue played. Recording will continue after pausing other applications. Use while recording other messages.
ⓧ	ⓧ	Send Attach message to email for sending QuickVoice mail. A default email address must first be selected in Preferences.

Button	Keyboard	Function
⏮	⏮/Down Arrow	Channel Increment channel.
Channel Counter	ⓧ	Display If you have selected a channel (Preferences), toggle display of channel name or number.
Message Counter	ⓧ	Display Toggle message title or file number.
-	delete	Delete Delete message. Deleted messages are moved to the Trash folder.

voice stickies, attach your voice recordings to e-mails or in certain email apps; will allow you to email directly through QuickVoice.

Some of the QuickVoice features are:

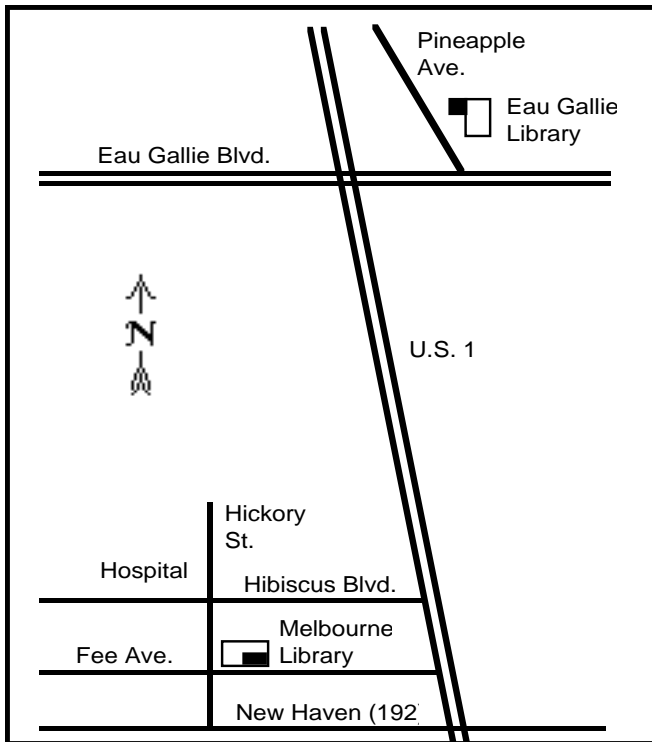
- The ability to move messages from one channel to another
- The ability to speed up, slow down or play recordings in reverse

- Set a time to record unattended
- Send recording to iTunes

Quick Voice plays with Quick Time player so anyone with the player application or with a Quick Time plug-in on their computer can play the recordings. You can also import the recordings into iTunes and change the format

You will need a microphone in order to record with QuickVoice unless you are lucky enough to have one of the power books with the microphone built in.

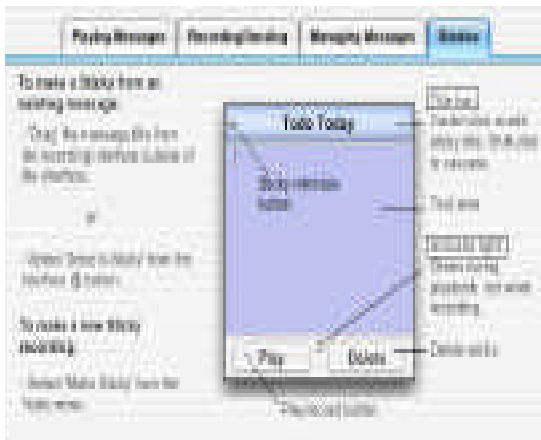

Also available are Audio Postcard and Voice Stickies. If you purchase QuickVoice, it comes bundled with Voice Stickies.

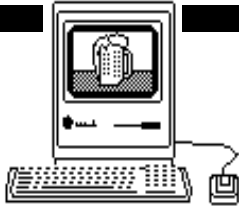

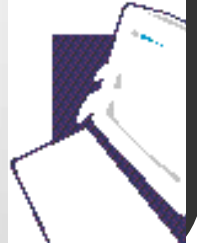
