Review of Mac OS X : The Missing Manual, Panther Edition (10.3)

Having run on the old operating systems for many years I thought I could do without a supplemental manual. If, my logic told me, I needed some help I would just click on help. Well, my logic wasn't so good.

Mac Help is not always so, well, helpful. Plus there is nothing so worthwhile as having a hands-on printed manual to thumb through. The Missing Manual does just that in spades.

What I liked most about this manual I found right off the bat. The Table of Contents. It outlines the contents in a very user friendly way. It is a great place to get used to using this manual.

The contents lists the things you most likely are looking for. Almost immediately I found topics that I was interested in. Faxing and Networking with Windows.

The detailed information is written in an easy to read format and makes no bones about any limitations. For instance; Hitting the return key to start a new paragraph is almost automatic isn't it?

However, in the Fax section the manual warns you; "Don't press the return key to start a new paragraph, - - the return key triggers the fax button and sends your message before it is finished."

Kind of handy to know, isn't it?

If you have a previous edition and upgraded to Panther, it is worth while to get this new edition, Mac OS X: The Missing Manual, Panther Edition. It is designed to help beginning to intermediate Mac fans.

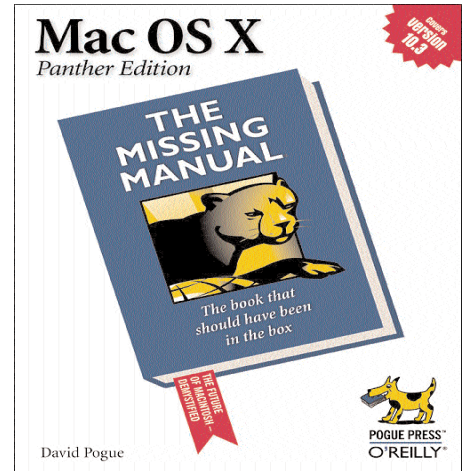
There are lots of tips, side bars figures and workarounds of use to even the more advanced users. Also new in this edition are mini manuals on iMovie, iPhoto, iChat, iTunes, Safari and other programs included with Panther.

There are 2 extensions that are available that fix the screen rewrite problems if you use Quark 4.x and OS X.2.8 or higher.

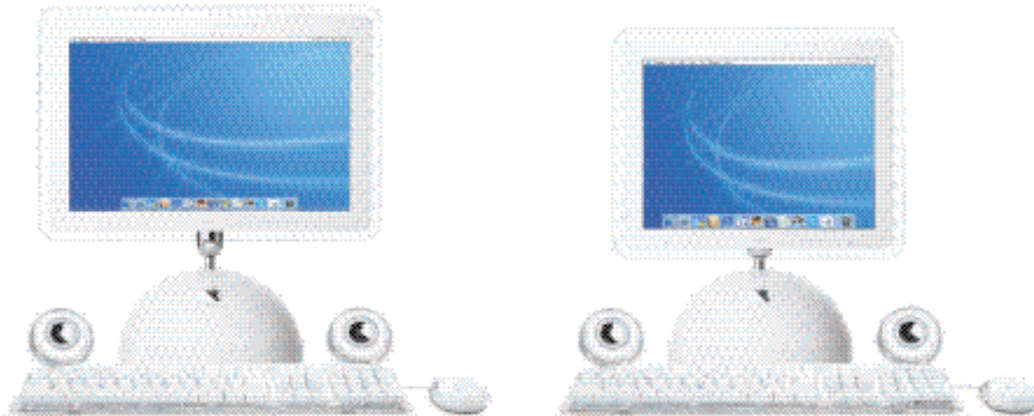
RedrawClassic XT redraws the QuarkXPress document windows which have afterimages when switching back and forth on Mac OS X Classic environment.

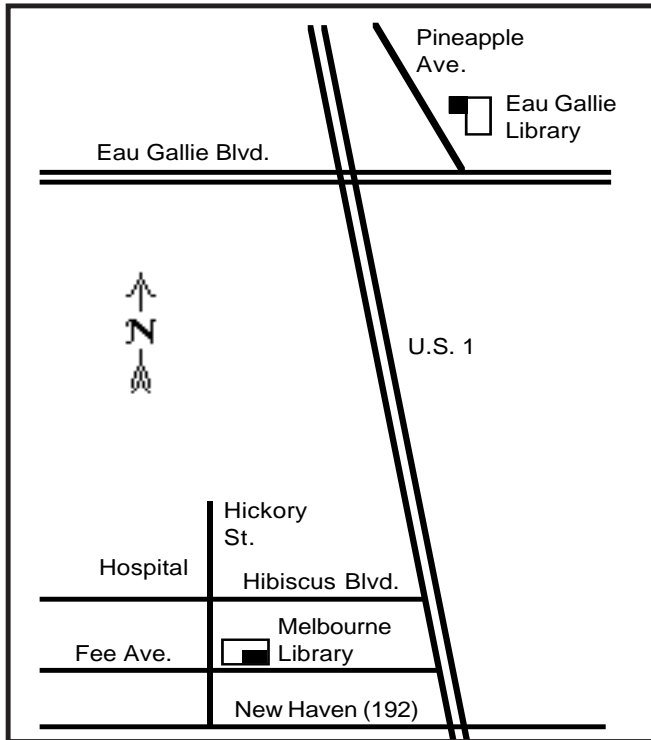

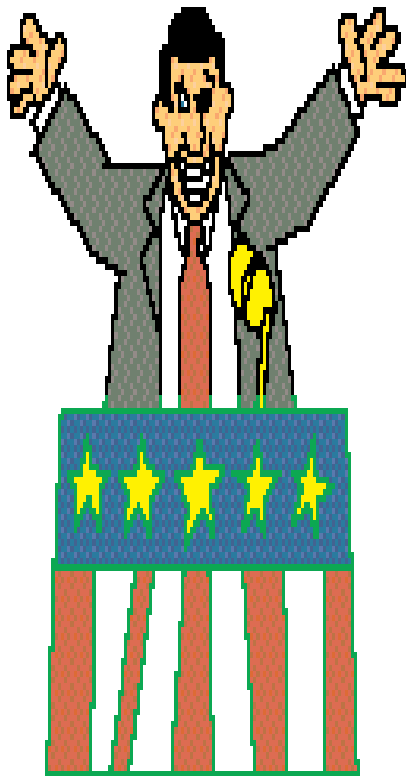

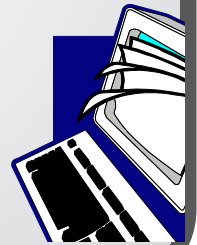
