Despite technical problems which made it difficult to see what was happening on the screen, we all got a good idea of how easy it is to get started in digital video (on the Mac!). In addition to an iMac or G4 (or possibly, a rev'd up G3) with a spare 15GB or so of hard drive space, you'll need a videocamcorder. Video camcorders support four different formats, including Mini Disc, DVD RAM, Digital 8, and Mini DV. Digital 8 and Mini DV camcorders enable you to go back and forth from tape media to digital, a consideration if you're looking to digitize existing film video. Apple's iMovie software is bundled with all new Macs, incredibly easy to use, and there are loads of tutorials and freestuff at www.apple.com/iMovie. David recommends two books: iMovie 2: The Missing Manual, by David Poque, and iMovie for Dummies by Stauffer, Gore, and Mosiman. THE MINUTES About Last Meeting, May 21, 2002 by Mark Fosgate, Club Secretary

Jim Staal, our new president, opened the meeting at 7:05pm with approximately 30 persons present. Jim asked if we had any new members present to which the answer was one new lady. He then asked the new club officers to introduce themselves and state how long they have been Mac users and how they use their Macs in daily life. A wide amount of equipment and software is being used to do many different things and consequently makes for a rich resource to be used by the club.

Jim talked about what's happening within the club and what he would like to see the club improve on; namely more member interest in meetings and getting the word out about ourselves. He inquired of the group what type of classes and or SIGs we would be interested in having arranged.

Jim also talked briefly about the direction Apple is going with enhancements to its flagship operating system and recent updates to software and new machine releases, and asked me to discuss the new iBook release (three models at \$1199.00, \$1499.00, and \$1799.00). These new speed bumped iBooks are ideal for the person who wants power with light weight and mobility. I would buy the mid-range model because of its ability to burn disks as well as play DVD movies on the go while retaining a great mobility platform with its small form factor. The graphics capabilities and level 2 cache have been upped significantly while the processor speed has been bumped 100Mhz in all models.

Jim discussed the upcoming board meeting to which members are invited and able to participate. Meeting scheduled for Appleby's in Palm Bay at 4:30pm, Sunday May 26th.

David Smith did a presentation on iMovie2 using Mac OS X. David showed off many of the features in iMovie2 including importing film, editing clips, adding enhancements to the clips in the form of transitions, and sound and music effects. David used an Focus Enhancements scan converter to show his work as our club projector is only capable of 640x480 at 60Hz when directly connected to a computer and was thus able to display at 1024x768. Great presentation David.

Dinner site voted on was Bennigan's. Meeting adjourned at 8:45pm.
